ADMISSION TO FELLOWSHIP POLICY (Medical Faculty)



1. INTRODUCTION

The Australasian College of Cosmetic Surgery and Medicine (ACCSM) promotes high quality cosmetic medical and surgical practice. Its members are expected to adhere to the technical and ethical standards of the ACCSM, The Medical Board of Australia, and the Medical Council of New Zealand.

The ACCSM admits to its Cosmetic Medicine Fellowship only practitioners who have successfully completed all components of the cosmetic medical training program or those that are approved via the accelerated pathway.

2. PURPOSE

This policy outlines the training, assessment, and admission requirements for Fellowship of the ACCSM Faculty of Medicine.

3. SCOPE

This policy applies to:

- All applicants for medical Fellowship of the ACCSM.
- The Dean, which is responsible for the assessment and recommendation of Fellowship applications for Censor in Chief endorsement.
- The ACCSM Censor in Chief, who is responsible for final approval of Fellowship applications.
- The ACCSM Board of Censors and ACCSM Council.

4. REQUIREMENTS FOR FELLOWSHIP

4.1 GENERAL REQUIREMENTS

All applicants for ACCSM Fellowship must:

- a) Be in good standing as a medical practitioner, with no conditions, restrictions, undertakings or suspensions on their medical registration.
- b) Have no indictable convictions in the last ten years, or any other offence which may bring the ACCSM into disrepute.



- c) Provide only true and verifiable information in their application.
- d) Disclose any bankruptcy, insolvency (where they were a Director or Executive) or any other relevant legal or regulatory issue which includes the need to prove dishonesty.
- e) Demonstrate currency of practice in accordance with the Medical Board of Australia's *Recency of practice registration standard*.
- f) Pay any applicable fees to the ACCSM.

The ACCSM reserves the right to ask for more information about any disclosed activity. It may at its discretion withhold the awarding of a Fellowship if it considers that the reputation of the ACCSM will be put at risk.

4.2 FACULTY OF MEDICINE REQUIREMENTS

4.2.1 Minimum Requirements

 Applicants who wish to become Fellows of the Faculty of Medicine must successfully complete all components of the ACCSM Cosmetic Medicine Training Program.

OR – can follow the Accelerated Pathway, in which case the minimum requirements are outlined below.

- Have completed a minimum of seven years full time cosmetic medicine practice.
- Complete a Recognition of Prior Learning assessment.
- Complete any training that may be required as per the RPL assessment.
- Complete and pass the ACCSM viva voce examination.
- Complete and pass all other requirements as determined by the BOC.

5. APPLICATION AND ADMISSION PROCESS

5.1 APPLICATION FOR FELLOWSHIP

5.1.1 In order to proceed, the applicant must have been notified that they have satisfied all the requirements of the Cosmetic Medical Training Program.



5.2 REVIEW AND APPROVAL OF APPLICATIONS

- 5.2.1 ACCSM administrators will check each file for completeness, before forwarding the file to the Dean, Faculty of Cosmetic Medicine.
- 5.2.2 The Dean reviews all applications for Fellowship, including:
 - Applicant File
 - Training program portfolio
 - Examination results
- 5.2.3 If the Dean is satisfied that the admission requirements have been met, they will make a recommendation to the Board of Censors to formally approve the admission to Fellowship. The decision will then be reported to Council at it's next meeting.

5.3 COMMUNICATION OF OUTCOMES

The ACCSM will communicate the outcome to applicants in writing. If approved, the correspondence shall notify the applicant:

- The date of admission to Fellowship
- That they are entitled to use the relevant post nominal (see 5.5)
- They will have the opportunity to have their Fellowship conferred at the next available ceremony (usually at the annual Cosmetex conference)
- That they are entitled to a certificate of Fellowship of the ACCSM

5.4 ENTRY INTO THE REGISTER OF FACULTIES

Once approved, the name of the Fellow will be added to the relevant Faculty Register of the College and published.

5.5 POST NOMINALS

On admission to Fellowship, Fellows of the Faculty of Medicine are entitled to use the following post-nominals: FACCSM (Med).

6. FEES

Application fees for admission as a Fellow are published on the ACCSM website at www.accsm.org.au. All applicable fees must be paid before the admission to Fellowship application is assessed.

Once the applicant has been approved for Fellowship, the ACCSM Fellow membership subscription fee will be payable annually.



7. RECONSIDERATION, REVIEW AND APPEAL

An applicant may seek reconsideration, review or appeal against any decisions or outcomes made in relation to their eligibility for admission to Fellowship under the ACCSM Reconsideration, Review and Appeals Policy. Applicants should contact the ACCSM for more details about the process and applicable fees.
